

# Chéf's Corner

# Pasta Primavera

() Cook Time: 30 Minutes ∑ Prep: 10 Minutes

Serves: 6-8

# Ingredients:

- Bow Tie Pasta
- Shredded Chicken
- 2 Cloves of Minced Garlic
- 8 Tbsp of Butter
- 11/2 Cups Heavy Cream
- 1 Cup grated Parmesan / asiago mix

- Diced yellow Onion
- 1/2 cup Diced Cherry Tomatoes

- 1/2 sliced White Mushrooms
- 1 cup Spinach
- Salt & Pepper to taste
- Parsley (to garnish)

# Instructions:

- Step 1: In a large pot bring water to a boil and add in the bowtie pasta.
- Step 2: While the pasta cooks, chop additional ingredients. Garlic, yellow onion, cherry tomatoes and white mushrooms.
- Step 3: When pasta is close to done add the butter, garlic, mushroom and onions to a large sauce pan and sauté.
- Step 4: Add in shredded chicken and spinach and incorporate well.
- Step 5: Next strain the pasta (save some of the pasta water and set it aside)
- Step 6: Stir in the cooked bow tie pasta and shredded chicken.
- Step 7: Now add the grated parmesan / asiago cheese, cherry tomatoes, salt/pepper and stir until it is fully combined. Use the pasta water set aside if needed to achieve the desired texture.
- Step 7: Plate, garnish and Enjoy!

# A MESSAGE FROM THE CHEF

ummertime is coming to an end and giving way to the fall and winter months. Before we say a full farewell to the warmth and sunshine, here is a refreshing and well known recipe for pasta primavera. It's name meaning "spring pasta", full of vegetables and color making the name very fitting. To start, gather the freshest vegetables you can find. Begin by sauteing minced garlic and diced onions in a large skillet with a splash of olive oil or butter until they turn golden and fragrant. Next, add your prepared vegetables to the skillet, tossing them gently to coat with the garlic and onion mixture. Season with a pinch of salt, a dash of pepper, and a sprinkle of dried Italian herbs. Cook the vegetables until they are tender but still crisp, about 5-7 minutes. While the vegetables are cooking, bring a large pot of salted water to a boil and cook your pasta of choice until al dente. Classic choices like farfalle or penne work wonderfully, but feel free to use whatever pasta you prefer. Once the pasta is cooked, drain it and add it directly to the skillet with the sautéed vegetables. Toss everything together, allowing the flavors to meld. For an extra touch of richness, stir in a generous handful of grated Parmesan cheese and a splash of heavy cream. Finish with a sprinkle of fresh basil or parsley, and a squeeze of lemon juice to brighten the flavors. Serve your pasta primavera hot, accompanied by a slice of crusty bread and a light, crisp white wine, if desired. This delightful dish not only captures the essence of spring and summer but also provides a comforting transition into the cooler months, keeping the spirit of warmth and sunshine alive just a little longer. Enjoy!



Making a false or fraudulent workers' compensation claim is a felony subject to up to five years in prison or a fine up to \$50,000 or double the value of the fraud, whichever is greater, or both imprisonment and fine



up to \$7,500. Maximum loan amount of \$5,000 qualifies for one-time any use provision. Loan amounts \$5,001-\$7,500, funds must be used for qualified professional use. Qualified professional use includes work equipment, uniforms, supplies, firearms, ammunition, K-9 accessories, First Responder/Law Enforcement approved education course (up to 1 year) and certification training courses such as POST required courses. NOTE: For educational and certification training use, funds must be disbursed directly to the training institution, or reimbursement to member if valid receipt provided showing payment made within preceding 60-days.

# **Correctional Deputies' Ability To Carry A Concealed Firearm Off-Duty**

What You Need to Know

#### WHAT IS LEOSA?



he Law Enforcement Officer Safety Act of 2004 (18 USCA §926) permits qualified law enforcement officers with proper identification to carry a concealed firearm

nationwide, regardless of state laws (with some exceptions)<sup>1</sup>. Thus, those who meet the requirements under LEOSA do not need a state-issued concealed carry permit (CCW) to carry a concealed firearm.

#### WHAT ARE THE REQUIREMENTS?

To be a "qualified law enforcement officer" under LEOSA, seven requirements must be met. The first three requirements are as follows:

- 1. Be an **employee** of a government agency who is authorized by law to engage in or supervise the prevention, detection, investigation, or prosecution of, or the incarceration of any person for any violation of law;
- 2. Have the statutory power of arrest; and
- 3. Be authorized by the agency to carry a firearm.

#### DO ARMED CORRECTIONAL DEPUTIES (ACDS) QUALIFY?

Yes. The Sheriff has authorized Correctional Deputies who have met the Department's firearms qualification requirements to carry firearms while assigned to specific duties (e.g. transportation unit, med-car, permitter checks). This authority is granted by section 830.1(c) PC and qualifies ACDs to hold peace officer status under the Penal Code.

Therefore, ACDs who have undergone the training and qualifications set forth by the Department will satisfy the first three LEOSA requirements and be authorized to carry a concealed firearm without a CCW. ACDs who have undergone the training and qualifications set forth by the Department will satisfy the first three LEOSA requirements and be authorized to carry a concealed firearm without a CCW.

#### WHAT OTHER REQUIREMENTS MUST I MEET TO BE PROTECTED BY LEOSA?

First, you cannot be the subject of any disciplinary action by the agency. Although courts have not defined what constitutes "disciplinary action," legislative history and advisory texts infer that it includes suspension of peace officer powers and/or revocation of Department ID or badge.

Second, you must meet your agency's firearms qualification requirements with the weapon you are carrying. This means staying compliant with all your Department's minimum standards for firearms qualifications.

Third, you must not be under the influence of alcohol or any other intoxicating substances while carrying a firearm. Meaning – if you are carrying concealed while drinking and come into contact with law enforcement, not only do you forfeit LEOSA protections, but you will also be subject to all relevant crimes pertaining to carrying a concealed weapon while intoxicated.

Fourth, you must not otherwise be prohibited from carrying a firearm under federal law. Including: being charged with a felony; being subject to a Domestic Violence Restrain-

ing Order or prior DV convictions; receiving, possessing, or storing stolen firearms; or knowingly selling or giving a firearm or ammunition to anyone who falls within the above categories.

# PROOF OF QUALIFYING STATUS ON PHOTO ID:

While carrying a concealed firearm, you must also have photo identification issued by your agency that states you are a peace officer with LEOSA protections. Otherwise, you could be subject to arrest.

Note: Your agency is not required to issue you a LEOSA compliant ID, and it is your responsibility to request one once you meet the specified requirements.

#### DO STATE LAW RESTRICTIONS APPLY TO LEOSA?

No. LEOSA supersedes California state law – meaning, the restrictions on where a person is allowed to carry a concealed firearm under the Penal Code do not apply to an ACD with proper identification.

For example: §26230 PC (SB2) lists various locations that carrying a concealed weapon is prohibited, even to those with a valid CCW. However, because LEOSA supersedes California state law, none of those restrictions apply to an ACD with proper LEOSA identification.

But there are exceptions! LEOSA does not supersede state laws that allow a private person or entity to prohibit the possession of concealed firearms on their property or government property. Thus, an ACD with a LEOSA compliant ID is still prohibited from entering private property with posted restrictions and government buildings while carrying a concealed firearm.

For example: Private entities, including large venues such as Dodger Stadium, Crypto Arena, Disneyland, Universal Studios, as well as small private businesses such as a bar or restaurant are allowed to prohibit the carrying of concealed weapons on their property. Meaning – even with LEOSA compliant identification there are no protections from criminal penalties for carrying a weapon onto private property when the owner has made clear that carrying a concealed weapon is prohibited.

#### **DO CORRECTIONAL DEPUTIES QUALIFY?**

No. Although both CDs and ACDs supervise the incarceration of inmates which includes investigating, detecting, and preventing further crimes in a correctional facility and can arrest/charge a person with a crime with the requisite probable cause, CDs are not permitted to carry firearms. Thus, because the third requirement is not met, Correctional Deputies do not qualify to carry concealed under LEOSA.

#### DOES THAT MEAN CDS CANNOT CARRY A CONCEALED FIREARM?

No. CDs can still apply for a CCW permit and carry a concealed firearm once the permit has been issued.

However, there are no LEOSA protections for Reserve Officers carrying with only a CCW.

Therefore, if carrying with only a CCW, you must abide by California state law including the restrictions outlined in §  $26230 \text{ PC}^2$ 

Currently, carrying a concealed firearm is prohibited – even with a valid CCW – in the following areas: bars and restaurants that serve alcohol, playgrounds, youth centers, parks, athletic facilities, most property controlled by Department of Parks and Recreation or Department of Fish and Wildlife, casinos, stadiums/arenas, public libraries, amusement parks, zoos, and museums; parking areas and similar areas connected to those places or to other sensitive places listed in the statute. (See Penal Code sections 26230(a) (9), (11), (12), (13), (15), (16), (17), (19), and (20)).

#### **BOTTOM LINE:**

ACDs who have been issued LEOSA compliant identification from their agency, can carry a concealed firearm with full LEOSA protections so long as the above requirements are met.

Additionally, LEOSA supersedes California state law; but ACDs carrying under LEOSA must use their best judgment when entering private property with gun restrictions.

Although CDs do not qualify under LESOA, they may still carry a concealed weapon if they have been issued a valid CCW. However, even with a valid

CCW, they must follow California conceal carry laws including the restrictions in § 26230 PC.

Stay Safe and Informed! \*

<sup>2</sup> As of the recent Ninth Circuit decision in Wolford v. Lopez, the State of California cannot prohibit CCW holders from carrying a concealed firearm in the following areas: hospitals, public transit, gatherings that require a permit, places of worship, financial institutions, and parking lots connected to those areas. (See Penal Code sections 26230(a)(7), (8), (10), (22), (23), and (26)).

# **Workers' Comp: Protecting your future** self and wealth

hen starting a career in public safety, retirement is usually the last thing (literally) to think about. During a public safety member's career, a member often grapples with concepts of retire-



ment and it is not uncommon to hear a client say "I wish I would've known then, what I know now." Unfortunately, many members do not consider how workers' compensation factors into their career, retirement and future financial and medical wellbeing.

This month RSA hosted a Pre-Retirement Seminar for members and their families where I discussed topics including how workers' compensation impacts your retirement, understanding "injury" and navigating the Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR) process. I also provided answers to the most common questions surrounding filing a workers' compensation claim while also dispelling work comp myths and rumors.

#### **"I DON'T PLAN ON RETIRING ANYTIME SOON SO WORKERS' COMP** DOESN'T REALLY APPLY TO ME."

Unfortunately, I hear this often. I've represented many retired members who wish they had documented their injuries and treatment throughout their career. Documenting and/or filing a claim for an injury during your career does not mean you are medically retiring (or even trying to.)

#### **"I'M THINKING OF RETIRING WITHIN THE NEXT FEW YEARS. I'LL FIGURE MY WORKERS'** COMP OUT WHEN I DECIDE A DATE."

Getting close to retirement can be overwhelming and I understand the members desire to "deal with it later." Depending on whether you have documented and protected your injuries throughout your career, now is a vital time to take an inventory of what your body has been through, with an eye towards extending your career to meet your retirement goals.

#### **"I'M READY TO RETIRE, BUT WHAT DOES** WORKERS' COMP HAVE TO DO WITH IT?"

Hopefully a member has documented and protected their injuries; however, if not, it is critical a member makes a decision, before they leave. Assess your body and see what medical conditions or problems you are experiencing and whether those condition may be work-related. Essentially, has work caused or contributed to this problem or condition?

#### **"I ALREADY RETIRED, SO I'VE MISSED MY OPPORTUNITY TO FILE A CLAIM FOR MY INJURIES."**

Many members (mistakenly) decide to retire and "figure out workers' comp after." After retirement, a member is under certain time limitations to file a claim for injury and benefits. Continuing to wait before assessing your situation will only make a claim more difficult, and in some scenarios, impossible.

# Senate Bill 636 Still Needs To Grow

enate Bill 636 was reintroduced to the California legislative body on August 22, 2024 by Senator Cortese, the Bill has passed the Assembly on August 29, 2024, and passed the Senate on August 30, 2024. This Bill is sponsored by the American Federation, State and County Municipal Employees, Union of American Physicians and Dentist and California Neurological Society. The Bill is constructed because the current Utilization Review doctors are not mandated to have state licenses, this can limit proper medical care to cure or relieve the effects of the injury.

This legislation mandates that the Utilization Review doctors be licensed in California and this mandate of licensing goes to utilization for private employers that will commence as of July 1, 2026.

#### HOLDING DOCTORS ACCOUNTABLE

The discussion was that the Senate Bill 636 is a necessity because of lack of state licensing means that there is no regulatory structure to hold the Utilization Review doctors accountable for malpractice or other inappropriate conduct.

The opponents of the Bill out of the California Chamber of Commerce in the California Coalition of Workers' Compensation argue that the Utilization Review is based upon national recognized standards and any variation should be done based upon evidence nationally recognized standards.



If the doctor is not mandated to be a California licensed doctor, they would not be subject to the Medical Board of California's review and discipline.

The second element of the argument against the mandate of licensing of Utilization Review doctors in California is that this mandate could reduce the number of doctors available for Utilization Review, mandate factor in driving up the cost.

The current regulations on Utilization Review prohibits any person other than a licensed physician who is competent to evaluate specific clinical issues involved in medical treatment services for modifying, delaying or denying requests for authorization of medical treatment to cure or relieve.

The mandate that the utilization doctors are to be licensed by the state of California creates more accountability on the doctors. The physicians that are not mandated would not be subject to other aspects such as the Medical Board of California. The Medical Board of California is a California State Government Agency which can impose discipline on medical doctors who fail to meet certain standards of care.

If the doctor is not mandated to be a California licensed doctor, they would not be subject to the Medical Board of California's review and discipline.

The Medical Board of California is an organization to ensure a high standard of care.

#### MORE ROOM TO GROW

This legislation eliminates governmental entities, i.e., public employers such as the State, County, City or other governmental entities, from being subject to the mandate the Utilization Review doctors have to be licensed in California and again subject to the Medical Board of California. These



limitations on public employers need to be removed to protect all workers.

There has been, and continues to be, many options available for the employer or the provider of care to directly or indirectly discourage the medical care. This new legislation removes some of the potentially manipulative maneuvers that the adjuster could take because the Utilization Review doctors would be subject to the California Medical Board potentially.

The concerns that the opponents have failed to consider delays in medical care not only causes harm to the worker, but potentially increases substantial costs of the medical provider and a longer period of time of the worker being off of work, or further damages occurring because of delay in medical care.

The concept of the mandate of licensing of Utilization Review doctors is a necessity that indeed could provide more expeditious medical care and lower time off, cost to the employer, and lower harm to the worker.

The elimination of the public employers does not benefit the society. The public employers should also be mandated to utilize Utilization Review doctors that are licensed within California.

#### **EXAMINING THE KING CASE**

This change by Senate Bill 636 once signed by the Governor creates a greater opportunity for the worker to be cured and relieved of the effects of the injury.

Returning back to the heavily charged *King* case in which there was a delay of medical care causing seizures needs to be examined again. The legislative enactments that were drafted and set forth in Labor Code 4610.5(3)(4) that the Utilization Review doctor was not subject to the medical malpractice case pursuant to findings in *King v. CompPartners Inc.* 

Currently, the UR doctors do not see the patient nor are they required to be licensed in California. The pivotal case in the California Supreme Court decision, King v.CompPartners, Inc., a UR doctor who was being sued for malpractice as was his employer took the position that different rules and duties apply to UR doctors. The defendants in this case, the doctor and CompPartners, argued that the treating physician obviously has a responsible role in the day to day care of the injured worker they treat, but UR doctors do not have a duty to thoroughly vet each case brought to their attention and have immunity for their responsibility of any care, negligence or harmful decisions they make regarding the denial or limitations of medical care (Labor Code \$4610.5(3)(4).




In the *King* case, this individual was denied appropriate medical care that then caused seizures. There was a suit brought against the utilization review doctor for failure to apply appropriate standards in the curtailing of the medication. The case went to trial and ultimately made itself to the California Supreme Court. The Supreme Court came back and indicated that because of the legislative enactment pursuant to Labor Code §4610.5 (3)(4), the doctor that did the Utilization Review was not subject to the malpractice lawsuit. The specific legislation that was placed in §4610.5 (3)(4) had unbeknownst to most people afforded a umbrella of protection and the doctor did not have to meet reasonable medical standards regarding the medical care.

The *King* case also raised the specter that the current utilization review system needs to be reexamined, and specifically the fact that the tort remedies that the injured worker sought against the Utilization Review doctor were not available because of the specific legislation that was drawn and was not easily discernible as to the impact that was going to take place. The legislative body had created this new standard. The California Supreme Court in their opinion on the King case made a very strong statement. They stated "<u>the legislator may</u> wish to examine other existing safe guards provide sufficient incentives for competent and careful utilization review".

#### **A HIGHER STANDARD OF CARE**

The concept that the Utilization Review doctors must be licensed in California is a significant move. If the doctor is licensed in California and has a failure to meet particular standards this may force that doctor to recognize a higher standard of review and recommendations that if they do not meet those higher level of standards, even though they are utilization review doctors, they are now subject to the California standard of a medical practitioner and this could impact their license. Senate Bill 636 still needs to grow and expand to cover that all UR doctors are to be California licensed. **\***




